- 64 members were eligible to write their initial certification or SARE
- Total of 22 members did so with success (34%)
- ❖ 10 out of 52 eligible members got certified for first time (19%)
- This is more number of new CIC's from last year and years before that!

CIC STUDY GROUP

Based on needs assessment CIC study group was organized in Fall of 2018 in collaboration with Public Health Ontario-Central Team:

- Used webinar and teleconference to maximize reach to remote members
- 7 sessions facilitated by 9 certified members
- Benefited 30 attendees including some from neighboring Chapters
- Within two weeks, 4 were successful at their initial CIC and 3 members at SARE
