WHAT IS CORPORATE MEMBERSHIP?

Corporate Membership in IPAC Canada is intended to promote education, research and collaboration through continuous professional development in infection prevention and control and related fields, and to build long lasting, productive, mutually beneficial partnerships which support Corporate Members and IPAC Canada. Corporate Members manufacture products (e.g., disinfectants, hand hygiene products, IPAC equipment) or provide a service (e.g. inspections, education, guidelines). Corporate Members do not provide direct patient care, but may support patient care activities.

Corporate Members are afforded unique opportunities to build on this foundation; for example, the ability to participate on our Corporate Relations Committee (CRC). CRC members meet a minimum of two times a year with the IPAC Canada Physician Director and the Executive Director. Meetings are a forum to discuss issues of mutual concern, new opportunities mutually beneficial to Corporate Members and IPAC Canada, and of course, networking.

There are four levels of Corporate Membership: Platinum, Gold, Silver, and Bronze. The base membership fee for Bronze Level Corporate Membership is \$5000.00 (CAD\$) per annum (renewable each July 1st). Depending on any additional project or conference sponsorship you contribute to IPAC Canada nationally during the year, you are advanced to a higher level and are afforded additional benefits. Additions to Corporate Members' status/level do not include exhibit fees or chapter involvement.

The 'Corporate Member' is the company, not the individual who represents the company. For Corporate Membership, we ask for the name of an individual who will receive communication to the Corporate Member. Each Corporate Member may also appoint one individual to receive a complimentary membership in IPAC Canada, including full membership benefits. The contact person and the member may be the same individual.

CORPORATE MEMBERSHIP APPLICATIONS APPROVAL PROCESS

In accordance with IPAC Canada policy (8.50.1, Corporate Membership), the intent of this membership category is to promote education, research and collaboration, and to foster long lasting and mutually beneficial partnerships between Corporate Members and IPAC Canada. These relationships are based upon an understanding of each other's goals, and are of the highest ethical standards.

Applications for new Corporate Membership are reviewed by the Executive Director and/or IPAC Canada Board members, with an eye to ensuring the products provided or manufactured by the applicant are approved by Health Canada, when required, and are relevant to current Infection Prevention and Control best practices. The reviewers also view applicants' online presence (e.g. web site), company structure, and mandate to to ascertain if a mutually beneficial relationship is possible.

Guidelines For Presenting Practice-Based Webinars to IPAC Canada members



Corporate Members are eligible to present one 1-hour webinar per year on a practice-based topic. This is not a product promotion; however, the slide deck can include one slide promoting products that relate to the scientific content. Content must not include comparison with other products or disparaging of other commercial entities.

An abstract of the content must be approved by the Education Core Committee (through the Executive Director). The presenter may be chosen by the Corporate Member. Webinars may be hosted on IPAC Canada's Zoom platform, or on the industry partner's virtual platform.

The fee to host a webinar is \$2,000 CAD (no GST/HST) with the following exceptions:

Platinum Corporate Members – 2 complimentary webinars per year Gold Corporate Members – 1 complimentary webinar per year Silver Corporate Members – 1 complimentary webinar per year Bronze Corporate Members – 1 complimentary webinar per year.

Guidelines:

- 1. An abstract of the presentation must be forwarded to the Executive Director for approval by the Education Core Committee before announcement of the webinar.
- 2. The webinar can be hosted by IPAC Canada on its Zoom platform, or by the industry partner on their virtual platform.
- 3. IPAC Canada will forward a copy of the post-webinar evaluations to the host company. If the host company's virtual platform is being used, the evaluation link will be sent to the host to share with participants during the presentation.
- 4. IPAC Canada will forward a copy of the webinar recording to the host company to post on its own website. If the host company hosted and recorded the webinar, a copy of the recording will be sent to IPAC Canada to post on its website.
- 5. Industry-hosted webinars presented through IPAC Canada will be eligible for 1 IPU per hour of practice-based education (not product or service promotion) by the Certification Board of Infection Control.
