**Summary of Assigned Duties (Describe what the incumbent has to do to achieve main objectives; include main deliverables/achievements expected):**

During deployment, the duty station may change, and duties may be modified, based upon the technical needs of the Programme.

1. Identify measures to reduce nosocomial infection (NI) and healthcare worker infections (HCW) at healthcare facilities
2. Visit healthcare facilities to undertake and follow up on NI/HCW infections as required
3. Revise and upgrade current NI/HCW investigation forms as required
4. Review existing data sources for NI and HCW infection and improve/develop data management system to monitor and evaluate NI and HCW infections
5. Analyse collected data and report to MOH/WHO incident management team on findings
6. Develop strategies and action plans to reduce nosocomial infection in healthcare settings
7. Work in collaboration with implementing partners to address gaps
8. Conduct and/or supervise IPC briefings and trainings as required to address identified gaps using recently developed WHO/MOH training resources and making any needed update
9. Support WHO DRC IPC team as required, including performing any other related incident-specific duties.
